<u>What you need to know</u>



Roehampton Students' Union is a charity, directed and run by elected students. Once per year, students at Roehampton get the opportunity to vote to decide who to elect.

Becoming an elected officer is an excellent way to develop your leadership skills, enhance your career prospects, and make real changes that students want to see. It gives you the ability to shape the direction of RSU, represent over 18,000 students, and make important decisions.

All elected officers are full voting members of RSU Presidents' Committee. You can view more information on responsibilities of Sabbatical Officers and College Presidents on the RSU website.

There are three full-time Sabbatical Officer roles who each get paid £27,632 per year:

- RSU President
- RSU Vice President Education
- RSU Vice President Welfare

Sabbatical Officers exist to ensure the interests of all students are represented to the University, the RSU, and other stakeholders. They run campaigns, activities, and events to address issues affecting students.



There are also eight part-time volunteer roles - College Presidents & Deputy College Presidents - who help steer the direction of the Union and ensure the interests of all students are represented.

<u>The positions</u>



RSU President

The President is the lead representative of the RSU. They sit on various university committees, representig student views at the highest level. They also lead the majority of RSU activities and chair the charity's Trustee Board.

RSU Vice President Education

The VP Education takes the lead on student education at Roehampton. They work to improve your education, and sit on the highest university committees relating to education.

RSU Vice President Welfare

The VP Welfare takes the lead on all student welfare issues at Roehampton. They ensure students are represented in such like accommodation, welfare, and EDIA at the university.

If you are considering running for a position, the election process is broken down into three main periods, with important deadlines and meetings to consider throughout:

- 1. Nominate yourself
- 2. Campaign
- 3. Voting



NOMINATIONS

Friday 17 Jan - Wednesday 12 Feb

If you want to run in the elections, you've got to do four things during nomination period:

- 1. Read the rules
- 2. Write your manifesto (check the RSU Members' Manifesto for guidance)
- 3. Come up with a campaign slogan and find a photo of yourself to use
- 4. Submit your nomination via the RSU website

Your nomination and manifesto should be submitted by close of nominations on Wednesday 12 February (10am)

<u>CAMPAIGNING</u>

If you've decided to run for a position, there are a few sessions you **must** attend:

Candidate briefing

Here, you will meet the support staff administering the elections, have the opportunity to gain further understanding of the elections process, and how to run an effective campaign

• Candidate Question Time (Sabbatical Officer candidates only)

It's important that voters know the real you when they go and vote! Candidate Question Time is one of the many opportunities for you to share your vision with voters

VOTING

Tuesday 25 February - Thursday 27 February

This is a really important time for all candidates. It's your chance to campaign to the student body by promoting your manifesto, objectives, and generally getting your message across to students.
